

BELOVED


Reflection on Mark 9:2-10

The transfiguration of Jesus in today's Gospel is closely linked to His Baptism by John in the Jordan. On both occasions the sky speaks those words of generative love: "This is my beloved Son..."

At Jesus' Baptism, Mark reports that the proclamation, "This is my beloved Son," is followed by "with you I am well pleased." Each of us hear those same words spoken to us personally at Baptism, when we begin our lifelong journey of faith. At every stage of that journey, in every moment, we are embraced as daughters and sons who are beloved by God, and with whom God is pleased. This reality, this status of belonging in a royal, holy household, is not earned, but pure gift. God delights in you, His son, His daughter.

Whenever I hear this transfiguration story, where God follows those words of generative love with the command, "Listen to him," I am reminded of the last recorded words of Mary, the beloved Mother of Jesus, in the Gospel: "Do whatever he tells you." (from the wedding feast at Cana)

Listen to Him, and Do whatever He tells you. This journey of faith is a story that is the Word of God told throughout human history. It is told in the lives of our ancestors, and written by God with our lives as well. Listening to His Word, and doing what He instructs us to do, involves a daily and sometimes hourly choice to act in this world as if it were true that God is love, despite any evidence to the contrary. ~ Fr. CALLED AND GIFTED -COMPLETE PROGRAM

When you were baptized, you were given gifts of the Holy Spirit (called Charisms) that enable you to be a channel of God's love, truth, beauty, mercy, healing, and provision for others. The Called & Gifted Discernment Process has been used since 1993 by over 200,000 lay, ordained, and religious Catholics, and other Christians around the world. It is designed to help Christians

discern the presence of charisms in their lives. Charisms, or spiritual gifts, are special abilities given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit to give them power both to represent Christ and to be a channel of God's goodness for people. Whether extraordinary or ordinary, all charisms ought to be exercised in the service of God (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2003).

This 3-part series lays the foundation for discerning these gifts in your life. All three parts of the process are necessary for discovering where you are gifted. Seven sessions on Sundays from 1-2:30pm in Johnson Hall will begin on 3/3.

CATHOLIC LENTEN TRADITIONS

Did you know? The Sunday preceding Ash Wednesday is the last day when the Alleluia is pronounced preceding the Gospel. It will not be heard again until the Easter Vigil.

- Sundays in Lent are excluded from the penitential season. (Nehemiah 8:9-12)
 Sundays are for rest and are free of sacrifice, fasting, and abstinence.
- The Latin word "Laetare" means "Rejoice." The Fourth Sunday in Lent, Laetare Sunday, marks the half-way point of the Lenten season.
- Signs of joy are allowed on this day, expressing our belief in the hope of the Resurrection and to inspire us as we continue our Lenten commitments to prayer, fasting and almsgiving.
 - Symbolizing joy, rose-colored Mass vestments may be worn on Laetare Sunday instead of purple.
 - Many customs can be celebrated on Laetare Sunday. Find out more by making this a research project with your family during the Lenten season!



40 DAYS OF ADORATION

St. Francis is again joining with other churches in the Diocese of Columbus for 40 Days of Adoration during Lent to celebrate the Real Presence of our Lord, and further the Eucharistic Revival. There is no better way to recognize the true presence of our Lord than in Eucharistic Adoration. St. Francis will offer non-stop Eucharistic Adoration beginning Wednesday, 3/6 after the 6:30pm Mass and continuing through Thursday, 3/7 at 6pm. On 3/7 Adoration will take place in the Chapel until 9am. The Monstrance will be reposed in the main church after the morning Mass. Jesus will remain in the church throughout the day until 6pm when the Montrance will again be reposed to the chapel until exposed for the Lenten Reconciliation, Praise and Worship service beginning in the church at 6:30pm. Please plan to spend some time with the Lord during this special opportunity.
